Best in Sweepstakes #25

- Correct nose placement and undershot bite. Good pigment on eyes, nose. Beautiful head.
- Good top line, front and hind legs. Picked up solid for his age.
- Moved well

Best Opposite #8

- Correct nose placement and undershot bite. Pleasant looking head
- Good top line, tight front, OK hind legs. Picked up solid.
- Moved well.

## Critique by Michael Guy

It was a pleasure to judge The North Central Illinois Pekingese Club Specialty on May 25<sup>th</sup>, 2019. My following critiques of the winners on the day will reveal my process of assessment when judging the Pekingese. Qualities that are of prime priority for me in examining a Pekingese in random order are the correctness of bite, correct level top-line, soundness of structure front and rear and as Nigel Aubrey Jones told me personally and he also wrote in his book, the Density of the Pekingese or “Multum in Parvo”. Thank you for the opportunity to judge your specialty.

### BOB # 7

- Fawn brindle dog, good condition and balance. Correct coat of correct texture.
- Good undershot bite creating correct level lips and finish of mouth, correct planes, correct nose placement, nice eye, and pleasing balanced head.
- Top-line level without deviation. Front elbows tight, good bone on the front legs with correct rear action that was as sound as the front.
- Picked up solid, substantial spring of rib and good bone. Chest slung between front legs.
- Moved well, nice outline on the move, with correct roll.

### BOW& WB # 12

- Light Fawn bitch, not heavy in coat or over coated, adequate furnishing, coat of correct texture. Exceptional tone of muscles clearly a dog that gets exercise, in great condition. Well balanced.
- Perfectly undershot bite creating correct level lips, correct planes, and finish of mouth and placement of nose, nice eye, and pleasing head.
- Top-line level without deviation. Front elbows sound, tight elbows good bone on the front legs with correct rear action that was as sound as the front.
- Picked up solid and surprising density, substantial spring of rib, large chest capacity and wonderful bone. Chest Slung well between front legs.
- Moved well, nice outline on the move, with correct roll

### WD #33

- Fawn brindle dog, seemed a bit out of coat on the day, but also had adequate coat that did not obscure his correct shape. Compact dog well balanced.
- Good undershot bite creating correct level lips, correct planes and finish of mouth and placement of nose, nice eye, pleasing balanced head.
- Top-line level without any deviation. Front elbows sound, tight with good bone on front legs with correct rear action that was as sound as the front.
- Picked up solid with surprising density for his outline, substantial spring of rib and wonderful bone. Chest Slung between front legs.
- Moved well, with correct roll

### BOS # 8

- Red-Fawn bitch, well coated, balanced.
- Good undershot bite and finish of mouth, correct planes and placement of nose, nice eye, pleasing balanced head.
- Top- line level, front elbows sound, tight with good bone on front legs with correct rear action that was as sound as the front.
- Picked up solid with good spring of rib and good bone.
- Moved well.
